THIS is a sweet little parody that takes us into the Hansonite heartland where everything could be much better if none of these mice kept on arriving in the neighbourhood.

The exterminators are campaigning and petitioning, and if Shazza (played by Ruby Johnston) had half a brain, she would not encourage them. But her hermetically sealed world certainly does need a bit of stimulation.

She decides mice are nice, even if they fornicate like rabbits and make a mess. But the neighbours are watching...

This political satire of Australia's immigration laws is kept tangential, which makes even the squib a bit damp, but the three actors are bright and one-dimensional, and that's all that's needed to make the show serve its purpose.
